**BUTLER UNIVERSITY FRENCH AND FRANCOPHONE FILM FESTIVAL  
CONTINUES WITH *ROSETTA***

INDIANAPOLIS – In this third event of its French and Francophone Film Festival, Butler University's department of modern foreign languages will show *Rosetta* on Tuesday, Feb. 6 at 7 p.m. in Jordan hall, Room 141, on Butler's campus. The film is free and open to the public.

*Rosetta*, winner of two top awards in Cannes, is the story of a 17-year-old girl's search for a steady job, a normal life and the dignity she is denied by living in poverty with her unemployed, alcoholic mother. Shot by hand-held camera, the film captures real life at a deeper level, producing a powerful portrait of youthful hope and experience.

Directed by Luc & Jean-Pierre Dardenne, the 95-minute film is not rated and is in French with English subtitles. There will be introductory remarks and post-film discussion.

Films to be shown in March and April, include *Kirkou et las sorciere* and *La patinoire*.
